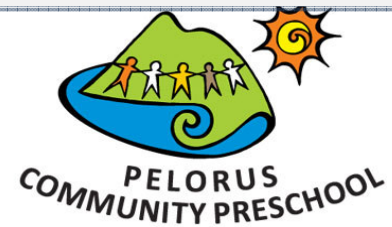
Toby Godsiff (4), Ashelyn Horton-Smith (4), and Putahi Hawira (4). We hope you all have a special day.
