## A Piece of History Deep Creek

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of October 1864, Deep Creek was surveyed by Theophilus Mabille into seventy, eight perch blocks, complete with the streets named Bridge, Camp and Seymour. The main thoroughfare was called Queen Street. There were four buildings, Cafe de Paris, Alcorns Store, a billiard room and a Bank of New Zealand.

In May 1872 Deep Creek contained two stores, two public houses, and a camp that was used as a Courthouse, a place of worship, and, at election time, a Polling booth.

Mr Moller had the contract to bring up the Post from Havelock on horse,

once a fortnight on a Thursday and back out on Fridays.

In the Pelorus Guardian 12<sup>th</sup> December 1890, Charles Diamanti advertised that on his bi-weekly mail trip he was prepared to convey passengers and parcels to any part of the Wakamarina and Havelock at the lowest rates. He had the agency for Pelorus Guardian and Miners Advocate, the advert was signed, Chas Diamanti, Post Office Deep Creek.

The Post Office at Deep Creek was closed on 10th October 1956, it was run mainly from the local shops, hotels and even private homes.

The Deep Creek Courthouse was erected in 1884 and was moved down to Queen Street in 1904. In the 1960s it was a bach and later burned down.

In 1936 the Hall was built at the southern end of Deep Creek, past the school, it was used for dances, meetings etc for many years. It had a hand painted back drop on the stage, painted by a miner Bob Smith.

Footnote: My sisters Rosemary and Heather went to dances in the Hall in the late 1950s. As a child I won an Iced Christmas Cake at a function in the Hall.
